SAUGATUCK, MICHIGAN – The Waterfront Film Festival is proud to announce its line up for the Student Filmmaker Showcase to be held 9:00 AM Saturday, June 12 at the Saugatuck High School (401 Elizabeth Street).

The showcase provides Michigan high school and college students an enhanced opportunity to enter their amateur films in the Waterfront Film Festival thanks to an \$850 grant by The Community Foundation of the Holland/Zeeland area.
