Michigan/Student Filmmaker Showcase 2005 CALL FOR ENTRIES ASPIRING FILMMAKER TO RECEIVE \$1000 WORTH OF KODAK® FILM

SAUGATUCK, Mich. -- In a continuing effort to promote the work of aspiring filmmakers in Michigan, the Waterfront Film Festival is proud to announce the fifth annual **Student Filmmakers Showcase** thanks to a generous grant of \$1000 from The Youth Advisory Committee of The Community Foundation of the Holland/Zeeland Area.

The Showcase is a screening of films by amateur filmmakers in Michigan with priority given to qualifying Holland/Zeeland area high school and college students. It is a rare opportunity for students to get exposure to their work. Last year eight films were viewed; two of which were from area high school students. The films will be screened during the Waterfront Film Festival weekend of June 9-12, in Saugatuck.

Entrants submit their films to the Festival through the Student Submission process and will be reviewed by the Waterfront Film Festival Film Selection Committee as a separate pool of applicants. The committee will award one student filmmaker a \$1000 grant for Kodak® film.

Requirements:

To qualify, entrants must:


- Be currently attending a college or university in one of the states along the Lake Michigan Waterfront (Michigan, Illinois, Indiana, or Wisconsin), OR
- Be a Michigan high school graduate currently attending a college or university, OR
- Be a current Michigan high school student

Submissions must be postmarked no later than April 26, 2005. Selected entrants will be notified advance of the festival with exact date, time and venue.
